### Club Hubs

The committee is delighted that our club has been chosen as a Club Hub for Croquet NSW together with the Canberra, Coutts Crossing, Strathfield and Toronto Croquet Clubs. The main aim is to increase the exposure of croquet and to improve the enjoyment of all members.

Tim prepared an excellent submission and, after being short-listed, Tim and I had an on-line meeting with three CNSW members.

It is hoped that the program will begin in May 2022. Before that there will be orientation and training.

The World Croquet Federation introduced the 6<sup>th</sup> Edition Rules of Golf Croquet on 7 March 2022. They will be implemented in Australia on 1 July 2022.

From 1 July all golf croquet events will be run under the new rules.
