Thank you to all the players, some playing in MNCCC matches for the first time, for being part of the golf croquet team.




# • Association Croquet against a combined Gloucester/Taree team at Taree

Another very close match – 3 games each to Taree/Gloucester and Port Macquarie. On a count-back the combined Taree/Gloucester team won with 75 hoops to 68.

#### • MNCCC – a brief history

 In 1958 the Hastings & Manning District Croquet Council (HMDCC) was formed by the Port Macquarie, Wauchope, Taree and Wingham croquet clubs.



- Wingham left in 1976 because of declining membership.
- Gloucester joined in 1990.
- Wauchope left in 1992 because of declining membership and Kempsey joined briefly.
- In 1995 the name changed to Mid North Coast Croquet Council (MNCCC) with the Forster, Gloucester, Port Macquarie and Taree clubs.

For 64 years the Port Macquarie club has competed and socially interacted with people from local croquet clubs.

The current format is: Inter-Club handicap matches and District Championships, in golf croquet, association croquet and ricochet, and an annual Christmas party. There is a strong connection between the clubs which we strive to keep.
