• We're Opening the Clubhouse!

After 9 months of lock-down we are delighted to be able to use our clubhouse again.

We have submitted a Covid-19 Safety Plan to the NSW Government, NSW Health and Croquet NSW. We will need to follow this meticulously and I ask you all to cooperate. The kitchen will not be open yet and there is to be no sharing of food or drink (other than people from the same household).

I will send you, in a separate email, our Covid-19 Procedures as at 11th December 2020. It will also be on our club website.

We now have a QR code for Covid-19 and ask those of you with smart phones to sign in with these, after downloading the Service NSW app, as well as registering for play in the green fee register.

Thank you all very much for your cooperation in our Covid-19 practices – booking all play with me, pre-paying green fees by bank transfer or bank deposit, signing the attendance book and washing the balls, hoops ... at the end of play. It has been a good team effort. One area that needs a little improvement is physical distancing on the veranda! Please be aware of this.





The next few months are likely to be very hot. It is important to keep well hydrated. As the clubhouse is now locked, it would be a good idea to have your own named bottle for easy access to water. A wet towel around your neck takes the heat out of your head! A sun hat and sunscreen are also advisable.

If you feel unwell, sit down in the shade, drink water and cool yourself down with water.

• "How can I help"?

A small group of members work very hard for the club. Below are a few ways you can all help.

- Set hoops.
- Get a few chairs from the equipment shed to put on the veranda, to help with social distancing.
- Observe social distancing (1.5m) at all times.
- Wipe down tables, chairs and surfaces used in the clubhouse at the end of sessions.
- As the last person to leave, sign the **Locking-up** sheet before locking the clubhouse door. This sheet is kept on the table just inside the door. Sometimes we need to contact this person.
- Remove some weeds from the garden beds.

Thank you to the members who helped to rake up the clippings from the scarifying of Court 3. The court will probably be out of action for 6 weeks.




Christmas Day
