## Becoming a Golf Croquet Referee

The club needs another batch of golf croquet referees. There is a four step process to become a GC referee:

- Complete the on-line course for Officials that can be found on www.sportaus.gov.au/coaches\_and\_officials/officials
  Once you have completed this send a copy of your certificate number to the SDR-GC at gcreferee@croquet-nsw.org
- 2. For you to proceed to Step 2 the SDR-GC will contact an Examining/Tutor referee who will supply you with the Open Book exam and the Lawncraft details required for Step 3.
- 3. Once you have completed the Open Book Exam you will be ready to proceed to Step 3 which is the Lawncraft section and you will have a copy of what is involved in that section.
- 4. Bridget will help you with the Lawncraft section, as a Tutor Referee, before Barb Piggott will arrange a test for you.
