Change of the Port Macquarie Croquet Club Constitution

I thank Jill Drury, Sue Moss and John Watson for the enormous time and thought they put into updating the club constitution. Changes in technology have altered the way in which clubs are run. This was made clear in the new Fair Trading NSW Model Constitution published in October 2022.

Eventually, when the need for change was made clearer, the new constitution was accepted. The By-Laws are now in a separate document.

The vote for optional uniform was rejected. This



means that all members will need to wear club uniform for all 12 club sessions. Club uniform is any combination of white, cream or royal blue clothes. Recent and new members of the club will have up to 3 months to acquire uniform.

Fees for 2023/2024

The fees for the 2023/2024 will be \$170 for the annual fee and \$8 per day for green fees. Members are asked to pay the annual fee into the bank by the end of June. Please let me know if you will not be renewing your membership.



Golf Croquet Rules Workshop



These clinics are run on Court 3: Clinic 1. Grip, Stalk, Stance, Swing; Clinic 2. Roquet, Stun shots; Clinic 3. Hoop running.

Pam is spending one hour on drills and finishing with a game that emphasises the skills practised.

Sign on sheets are on the tables beside the clubhouse door. The maximum number per course of 3 clinics is 6.

A further 3 clinics will also be held. These will cover: Clinic 4. Basic Strategy; Clinic 5. Around the Hoop; Clinic 6. Ball positioning, blocking.
