MNCCC Golf Croquet District Championship in 2006

Hoop Placement and Removal

Our aim is to have the hoops vertical and firmly placed in the ground.

- 1. Place the hoop so that the top of the carrot is above the ground.
- 2. The hoop legs must be vertical. To do this check using a spirit level to the side and back and front of the hoop-leg.
- 3. Tap the crown to adjust.
- 4. If the top of the carrot is too far into the ground, or if the hoop is not firm, raise the hoop so the carrot is above the ground. Dry sphagnum moss may be placed evenly around the top of the inside of the hoop hole.
- 5. To remove the hoop:
 - lift vertically, with no wriggling or
 - if it is too tightly in the ground, break the grip with upward strokes of the rubber mallet on the underside of the crown of the hoop.
- 6. In dry weather, after the hoops have been removed, use a watering can, kept inside the clubhouse, to thoroughly soak the area around the hoop.
