# 1. Potential New Members – Golf Croquet

- Interested persons can either get Bridget's contact number from the club website or be given her mobile number by a club member.
- Bridget briefly explains the game of croquet and the 3 codes we play at our club and explains that coaching with John Hincks will give basic skills for golf croquet, ricochet as well as association croquet. Name and contact details (mobile number and email address) are obtained and forwarded to John. These contact details are also forwarded to Tim so that he can register the person on the booking site.
- John is available to coach on a Monday and Friday morning. He gives 2 lessons covering basic skills and rules. The first lesson is free, the second \$8.
- After the 2 lessons, the person is invited to consider becoming a member of the club. Once an application is made, either online or by completing an Application for Membership form, it is given to the club committee to consider at their next meeting.
- In the meantime, the intended member is invited to partner with John in a game of golf croquet.
- Once the application has been accepted, the new member will be sent details about annual fees, court fees, uniform, session times, and asked for preferred name on badge and magnetic or pin attachment type.
- Bridget Earle is a back-up coach for John Hincks.
