The Mid North Coast Croquet Council (MNCCC) organizes competitions between the Forster, Gloucester, Taree and Port Macquarie croquet clubs. These local clubs have been socialising and competing for 65 years. The club delegates have always worked hard to maintain this contact.

Each year there are 2 types of competition in golf and association croquet and ricochet. The Inter-Club competitions, handicap events, take place during the first half of the year. The level play competitions, the District Championships, usually take place in September and October.

The Inter-Club golf croquet competitions will be in Advantage Handicap format. As well as looking for players your Captain, Tony Croft, will be looking for referees and scorer/time-keepers.
