February Forum Update

A very successful forum was held in February this year. Approximately 70 people were present. Brainstorming sessions for ideas to enhance the club were conducted. Eighty-six ideas were forthcoming. Approximately forty- two people volunteered to be part of 6 working groups. Except for the catering group, the other groups have met, studied ideas put forward, selected a coordinator for their group and have become very active. The working groups are:

SOFUN (fund raising, new member drive, promotion/publicity, social activities) – 8 members, coordinator Donna Sinclair

Grants - 6 members, coordinator Pam Wiemers

Grounds Maintenance - 10 members, coordinator Eric Drury

Purchase of Supplies - 3 members, coordinator Dawn Lane

Welfare - 5 members, coordinator Judith Wallis

Catering – 10 members, coordinator Jill Drury. I will be contacting members of the catering group once our association and golf carnivals are here.

The committee developed a set of 'working group guidelines'. Basically, all working groups must seek approval from the committee before putting any planned action into place. The SOFUN, Grants, Ground Maintenance, and Welfare working group submit a monthly report to the committee. Coordinators are also asked to submit a report to the annual general meeting in July.

The SOFUN working group has introduced 2 simple fund-raising ideas, 'hit the peg' and 'lucky numbers.' These 2 activities have brought interest to the members and so far, they have raised \$25 from 'hit the peg' and \$200 from 'lucky numbers.' The SOFUN group was responsible for the club's recent Facebook page. The group plans a Winter Solstice croquet afternoon on Saturday 22 June, commencing at 12.30 with a free sausage sizzle. A family and friends Fun Day is scheduled on Sunday October 13 from 11.am. Future projects include a market day with 'Come & Try' activities in conjunction with the Foreshore market day, school groups and corporate days.

The Grounds Maintenance working group meet each Thursday morning. Included in its regular activities are line marking, hoop moving and weeding. This group has also been responsible for organising the removal of 2 banksia trees as requested by the committee. One of the 86 ideas from the forum was to improve the Buller Street Garden area. This group has been active in preparing and submitting a draft plan and costings for this project. Another recent improvement by members has been the replacement and painting of the skip boards on the western side of court 1.

The Grants working group has recorded a register of possible grants. This enables them to inform the committee of any grant possibilities. The group has also provided guidelines for submitting a grant. Having studied the recommended plan and costings from the Grounds Maintenance working group for the Buller Street Garden, the Grants group has prepared a submission for a grant that will be emailed to Bunnings once approved by the committee. The Grants working group plans to next look at the possibilities of a grant for the painting and repairs to the club house, another idea coming from the forum.

The Purchase of Supplies working group is constantly active. We must not take for granted how this group serves the club.

The Welfare working group, like the Purchase of Supplies group works behind the scenes. We are grateful that they on the club's behalf care for our members who are not well or doing it tough.

As I look back over the brainstorming ideas put forward at the forum, I am aware that we have also addressed ideas such as U3A lessons, continuity of GC draws, flexibility for session tea breaks, rules review sessions and clinics for improving skills. Encouragement of people passing by the courts was yet another idea from the forum. Currently we are creating an information brochure for interested passersby, family and friends.

I know not all the ideas from the forum have materialised, yet as I look back many already have and will be in the future. Thank you to all club members for your contributions.

The G&G Team continues to be active in providing weekly maintenance of the courts and gardens by marking the lines, regularly moving the hoops and, when possible, attending to weeding of the gardens.

Further to these duties:

- 1. The banksia trees on courts 1 & 3 have been removed and stumps treated by "Accomplished Tree Management"
- Thanks to Eric Gadd and Peter Drinkwater, the skipboards on the western and southern sides of Court 1 have been freshened up, making a big improvement
- 3. The re-positioning of the hoop holes, as agreed to by the Committee last month, is in progress
- 4. Following vandalism of the clubhouse verandah window on the western side recently, Mark Bullivant promptly provided a temporary boarding up of the area for which we're all grateful.



The **Grounds and Gardening and Grants working groups** have applied to Bunnings, under their "Our Community Support" scheme, for help in creating a low maintenance, native oasis garden on the Buller Street frontage.

A Wagga

The term "wagga" is defined by the Macquarie Dictionary as a blanket made from hessian bags or similar material", but "wagga" is often now used as a generic term that refers to a functional quilt constructed from materials that are on hand.

I was born in Wagga Wagga and lived all my life in the area until we moved to Port Macquarie two years ago. My first lesson in sewing was stitching up chaff bags when I was just tall enough to reach the top of them. Over the years my sewing skills have improved considerably and quilt making has become one of my favourite hobbies.

Moving from Wagga Wagga I was able to bring a small amount of my favourite "stash" with me, and I had in mind a particular bundle of beautiful Italian wool and wool blend samples with the aim of turning them into a "wagga". My plan was to use blues and greys but as my "stash" was considerably diminished I reverted to a pattern contrasting lights and darks. The result is this quilt which I feel qualified to be called "wagga".
