# • From the committee

Over the past couple of months, the committee has spent time in considering how to best address the dry rot problem in our clubhouse. This has involved acquiring quotes for:

- Repair and replace rotted timber and painting
- Removing of entire timber and painting

At our last committee meeting it was decided to ask the grant working group to apply for a grant from the NSW State Gov Sports infrastructure. If successful, this grant would cover the cost of the removal of existing cladding boards and the installation and painting of James Hardie Linea 180mm fibre cement weather boards.

Cladding options for the clubhouse are completely dependent on a successful grant. Further deterioration will be a consequence for an indefinite time. A temporary solution to arrest the declining condition and to improve the general appearance and protection of the existing timber is with "bog", patch painting and

"band-aid" coverings over the worst affected areas. These measures are not intended as a long-term solution to this situation, but merely as a stop-gap measure until a more substantial grant can be secured. Mark and Julie Bullivant are prepared to finance and undertake a "bandaid, patch and paint" remedial endeavour. This offer is greatly appreciated.

Our club is fortunate to have an active grants working group. This group is diligent in seeking further grants to assist the club and its members.

#### **District Croquet – a brief history**

The Hastings-Manning Croquet group was formed between the Taree, Wingham, Wauchope and Port Macquarie clubs, for competitions and social interaction, over 60 years ago. After the Wauchope and Wingham clubs closed the Mid North Coast Croquet Council was formed when Forster and Gloucester joined the Taree and Port Macquarie clubs,

For more than 40 years the only game played was association croquet. The photo shows the silver trophy that was first awarded to the Division 1 champion in 1958. It often sits on top of our trophy cabinet. Now there are competitions in association croquet, golf croquet and

ricochet. Each year a team competition is held against Urunga in golf and

association croquet, and a Friendship Day is held with South West Rocks.
