

#### • Grounds Report

- Lawns 1 and 3 now available for play, Lawn 2 will be back in play early in 2026.
- The final \$ cost of the rejuvenation project is not available as yet but Eric advised that 250 HOURS from volunteers was freely given.
- Unfortunately the weeds are yet to be controlled, but attention is being given to chemical spraying (appropriate to the sensitivities of Queensland Blue Cooch). Over time, it is anticipated that the cooch will increase and the weeds decrease but it will require time
- The work shed will be cleaned out of outdated tools and the chemical cupboard will be repositioned.
- A White Board will be set up so that the seasonal and yearly plan for maintaining chemical spraying, fertilizing of lawns, etc.; and to keep a record of servicing, sharpening of mowers, and other information which helps with planning for and maintaining the lawns.





The morning tea to celebrate Christmas and the presentation of trophies was held on Sunday 7 December with over 30 members in attendance. The catering crew did their usual excellent work in cooking, preparing decorating and whatever else was needed. The Wagga quilt made and donated by Gloria was drawn and the lucky winner was Mick Green. A visit from Santa coincided with the drawing of the lucky door prizes. #### **MNCCC Report for December 2025 Committee Meeting**

8 of our members attended the MNCCC Christmas party, delegates meeting and presentation of trophies at Gloucester on Sunday 30 November.

At the delegates meeting a calendar of events for 2026 was worked out.

For association croquet and ricochet it was decided to have a one day competition for each. These will both be played at Forster where they have 4 courts. Graded blocks, with a maximum of 4 players in each, will play round robins. 14 point games will be played, with AC playing advanced handicap, and a time limit of 1 hour 30 minutes.

Advantage Handicap will again be used for the Inter-club competitions in golf croquet. There will be 5 rounds, stop on the bell, with a 1 hour 30 minute time limit. There will be a maximum playing handicap of 12. Captains will be asked to adjust the handicap cards of players whose handicap is greater than 12. Percentage results will be entered on the result grid. In games where players have not reached a score of 7, the percentage will be worked out before the players leave the court. If the percentages are equal a further hoop will be played to determine a winner.

The District Championship dates will be determined at the MNCCC General meeting in July.

The date of the Christmas party (13 December 2026) is at Port Macquarie, allowing time for the courts to be playable after lawn renovations.


